

# BOLDT CASTLE YACHT HOUSE



The Boldt Yacht House on Wellesley Island is open to the public and is a recommended tour during your visit to Boldt Castle. Visitors are invited to take the free shuttle boat from Heart Island for easy access to this imposing structure on the river's edge. The Boldt family's yachts and enormous houseboat were housed here in slips 128 feet long. Towering bay doors on the decorative façade provided access to the river. The building, rising 64 feet, also featured a shop to build racing launches and quarters for crew and staff. The grandeur of the Gilded Age is fully embodied in the structure's shingle-style architecture, tremendous towers and spires, and the steep-pitched gables.

The Boldt Yacht House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Inside the Yacht House, you will find a collection of antique wooden boats on display – courtesy of the Antique Boat Museum, Clayton, NY – some are from the original Boldt fleet. The intricately-designed service bay features custom-crafted steel trusses, mechanical overhead traveling cranes, screw jacks and more. This grand landmark, first open to the public during the summer of 1996, represents the 1000 Islands Region at its finest!
